

Promotion of Access to Information Act (PAIA) Manual

The Promotion to Access to Information Act, No 2 of 2000 ("the Act") gives effect to the constitutional right of access to any information in records held by public (government) or private (non-government) bodies that is required for the exercise of protection of any rights. Where a request is made in terms of the Act, Wealth Planners is obliged to release the information, except where the Act expressly provides that the information may or must not be released.

The manual has been prepared following Section 51 of the Act. The manual informs the requester of procedural and other requirements that a request must meet as prescribed by the Act. It is important to note that the Act recognises certain limitations to the right of access to information, including but not limited to, limitations aimed at reasonable protection of privacy, commercial confidentiality, and effective, efficient, and good governance, and in a manner which balances that right with any other rights, including such rights contained in the Bill of Rights in the Constitution.

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Procedure for requiring records (PAIA)

1. Form - A request for access must be made on a form that corresponds substantially with

Form 2 (Annexure A) to the Regulations relating to the Promotion of Access to Information,

2021. (Justice)

2. Assistance duty - If a requester cannot complete the form (e.g., illiteracy/disability), the

Information Officer will assist and complete Form 2 on their behalf.

3. **Submit to** - Information Officer, Wealth Planners (Pty) Ltd (see details above)

4. Timeframes - Requests are processed within 30 calendar days, subject to lawful

extensions.

5. Outcome & fees - The outcome (and any fees/deposits) will be communicated on Form 3

(Annexure A). Records are released once proof of payment is received.

Fees for accessing records

Fees are charged per Annexure B to the Regulations relating to the Promotion of Access to

Information, 2021. Where search/preparation exceeds six hours, a deposit (≤ one-third of the

access fee) may be requested.

Legal recourse against private bodies

When the requester is not satisfied by a decision made by the Information Officer of a private

body, for example for refusing access, for imposing access fees, or for extending the time period

in which the response is due, the requester may apply to court for relief within one hundred and

eighty (180) days of receiving the decision for more information that has caused the grievance.

The decision of the private body will be reviewed by a court and a decision will be made by the

courts as to whether or not to provide access to the requested records. Access to information

cases can be heard before the Magistrate's Courts as a court of first instance, as provided for

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under section 79 of the Act, and also the High Courts.

Complaints to the Information Regulator

If a PAIA request is denied or not answered, a requester may lodge a complaint with the Information Regulator using PAIA Form 5 (email: PAIAComplaints@inforegulator.org.za). Court relief remains available under PAIA.
